- Discuss health insurance options.

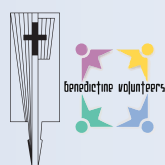
WHO WE ARE

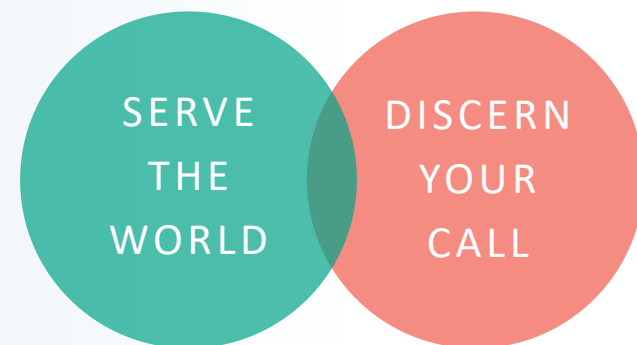

WHAT DO I GAIN AS A VOLUNTEER?

Financial Benefits | Volunteers receive room, board and a \$150 monthly stipend.

Spiritual Development | Volunteers develop a clearer knowledge of themselves, grow in their relationship with God, and learn skills for listening and responding to God's call in their lives.

Professional Development | Volunteers receive mentorship from a wide range of professionals during their time of service and exit the program with access to references for future endeavors.

Benedictine Experience | Volunteers develop life skills for community living, intentional service and disciplined prayer that enables them to effectively live out their unique purpose in the world.

Cultural Experience | Volunteers experience the natural beauty of life in the Dakota prairies, the chance to interact with members of the wider community through feeding the hungry and caring for the poor, and the wisdom of intergenerational community with the Sisters.
