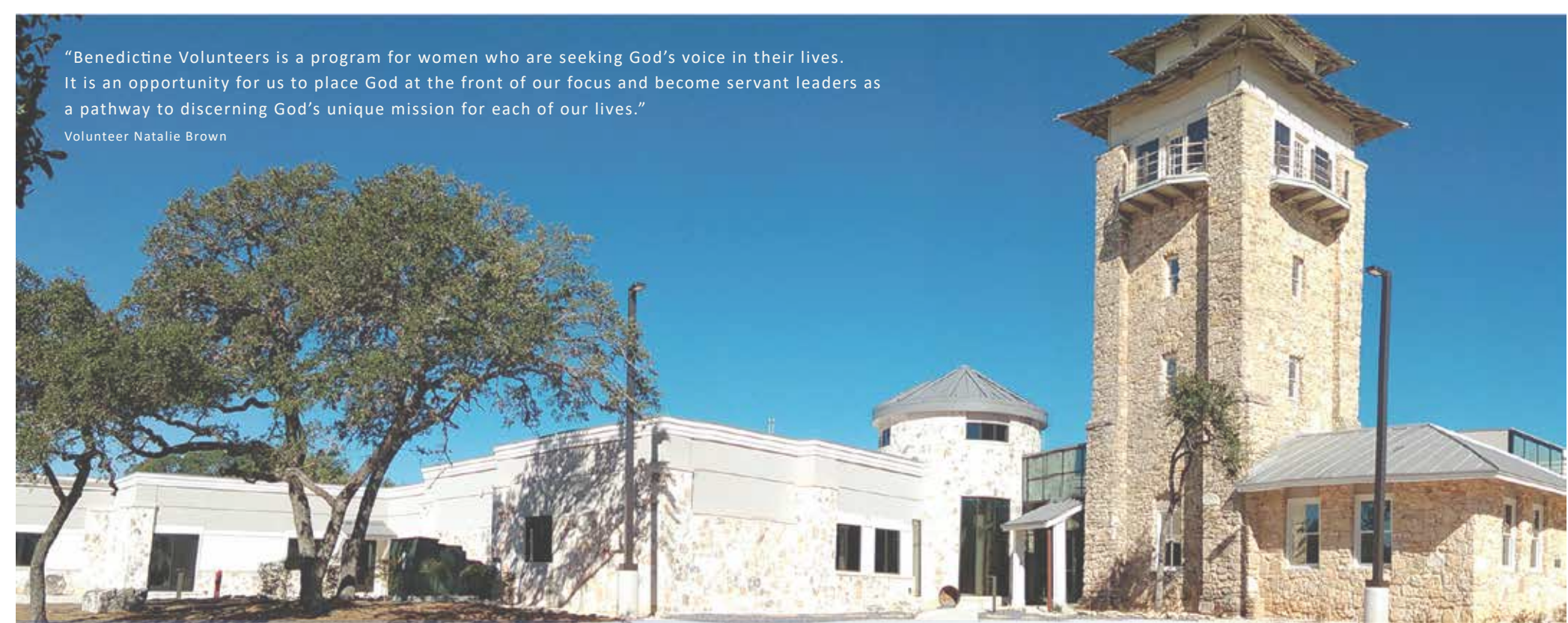

HOW DO I BECOME A VOLUNTEER?

Financial Benefits | Volunteers receive room, board and a \$150 monthly stipend.
